GREENSBORO, N.C. — Greensboro Science Center (GSC) visitors will be entertained, alarmed and enlightened as they walk through the halls of a ramshackle manor and experience the dangerous world of plants at Wicked Plants: The Exhibit. GSC members will have the opportunity to preview the exhibit on Friday, January 26, beginning at 1:00 p.m. The exhibit will open to all GSC visitors on Saturday, January 27. A media preview is scheduled for Friday, January 26 from 10:00 a.m. – noon.

Inspired by author Amy Stewart's best-selling book, "Wicked Plants: The Weed that Killed Lincoln's Mother & Other Botanical Atrocities," Wicked Plants offers a fun, safe and educational way to explore some of nature's most toxic flora. Two- and three-dimensional interactives fill a Victorian-era home, where visitors travel from room to room and learn about various poisonous plants that may be lurking in their homes and backyards. From a crime scene investigation in the potions laboratory, to sniffing stations in the bathroom, to a simulated graveyard featuring some of the most common deadly and toxic plants, Wicked Plants provides a comprehensive overview of an often unknown side of the natural world.

Chandra Metheny, GSC Horticulturist, says, "This exhibit will showcase a fascinating look into the mysterious botanical world of plants and how toxic specimens have played a downright "Wicked" role in history, medicine, and science. Visitors will be able to investigate some of these so-called "villains" of the plant world up close and determine for themselves just how these specimens tick!"

"We think Wicked Plants will be a big hit with school kids and families. This is a great chance for visitors to explore the darker - but really interesting - side of plant properties," says Martha Regester, the GSC's VP of Education.

Designed to educate the public and increase science literacy, Wicked Plants exposes visitors to plants associated with a myriad of negative health effects, including addiction, obesity, allergies, pain, poisoning, cognitive impairment, and even death. Showcasing more than 100 plants, the exhibit takes an open-ended approach to health education, providing visitors with an opportunity to weigh the risks of utilizing specific plants.
