**UNION GROVE, N.C.** — Fiddlers, banjo players, mandolinists and others will gather Memorial Day weekend in Union Grove for the Ole Time Fiddler's and Bluegrass Festival, a family-friendly weekend of performances, dancing and competitions. The event, whose history traces back to 1924, is the oldest continuous festival of its type in North America.

Local schoolteacher-musician H.P. Van Hoy and his wife, Ada, organized the first fiddlers convention to raise money for school supplies.
