Want reasons to visit the 16 Dream Big in Small-Town NC counties? Here's a selection of starting points.

Scenic Mountains

- **Graham County**: It's home to **Fontana Dam**, the tallest dam east of the Rockies. A storied spot on the Appalachian Trail, the dam was built to support the aluminum industry at the height of World War II
- <u>Haywood County</u>: Portions of the most visited National Park Service entities, the <u>Blue Ridge</u> <u>Parkway</u> and <u>Great Smoky Mountains National Park</u>, create signature experiences.
- <u>Madison County</u>: Indulgence seekers come to soak in the natural mineral baths at <u>Hot Springs</u>, located where the French Broad River meets the Appalachian Trail.
- <u>Mitchell County</u>: A rich mining history creates hands-on experience at <u>Emerald Village</u>, a complex of mines and museums off the Blue Ridge Parkway.
- <u>Yancey County</u>: A magnet for artists, the destination is home to Mount Mitchell, the tallest peak in the East and the centerpiece of North Carolina's <u>first state park</u>.

Northeast Lakes & Rivers

- <u>Edgecombe County</u>: <u>On the Square</u>, owned by the Windows on the World beverage director at the time of the 9/11 terrorist attack, makes the county seat of Tarboro a dining destination a few blocks from the Tar River.
- <u>Halifax County</u>: Bird lovers find much to love at <u>Sylvan Heights Bird Park</u>, home of the world's largest collection of rare and endangered waterfowl, and the <u>Roanoke Canal Museum & Trail</u>'s, part of the <u>N.C. Birding Trail</u>.
- **Vance County**: **Kerr Lake**, a 50,000-acre reservoir, is paradise for those who love fishing, camping, boating and sailing, nature trails, bird watching and more.
- <u>Warren County</u>: Lake lovers find twin temptations at <u>Kerr Lake and Lake Gaston</u> while food lovers relish the <u>restaurants</u> in downtown Warrenton.

Inner Banks

- **Chowan County**: History aficionados are lured to the wealth of sites and well-preserved architecture in Edenton, a remarkably pretty Colonial capital on the Albemarle Sound.
- <u>Gates County</u>: With its dreamy beauty, <u>Merchants Millpond State Park</u> beguiles hikers and paddlers who come for the views of old-growth cypress trees draped in Spanish moss.
- Hertford County: A singular take on history and innovation lends star power to the Brady C.
 Jefcoat Museum of Americana, whose exhibits include kitchens, taxidermy, wildlife and Native American artifacts.
- <u>Martin County</u>: The Roanoke River sets the scene for history as well as fishing, paddling and other recreation while equestrian events fill the calendar at the <u>Senator Bob Martin Eastern</u> <u>Ag Center</u>.
- <u>Perquimans County</u>: Baseball fans celebrate hometown hero Jim "Catfish" Hunter at the Perquimans County History Museum and pay tribute at Cedarwood Cemetery, where the Hall of Famer is buried.
- <u>Tyrrell County</u>: At the intersection of the Alligator River and the Albemarle Sound, Tyrrell is known for the natural treasures at <u>Pocosin Lakes National Wildlife Refuge</u> and <u>Pettigrew</u> <u>State Park</u>.
- <u>Washington County</u>: Travelers connect to the area's concentration of black bears with the <u>NC</u>
 <u>Black Bear Discovery Center</u>. Washington shares <u>Pettigrew State Park</u> and an Albemarle
 Sound shoreline with Tyrrell, the county next door.
