

Founding Fathers Distillery

Founding Fathers, a small batch, craft distillery, offers fine sipping whisky and rum, meticulously hand made by co-owners Jeff Cooper and Marta Smith Price. With quality a top priority, their spirits are designed and created, fermented and distilled, aged and bottled, all under one roof, with care, craft and quality. Private tours are offered with outdoor seating, inviting you to “sit a spell” as you enjoy your surroundings.



Brown Truck

Since opening in 2016, Brown Truck has won five Great American Beer Festival Medals including Gold for their American Light Lager, and Silver for their Dry Hopped Saison. The local brewery has become a favorite for locals, visitors and their four-legged friends.

Goofy Foot Taproom

In addition to serving their own microbrews, Goofy Foot Taproom provides visitors with the opportunity to taste beers from all over North Carolina and surrounding states.

Paddled South (New)

The newest brewery in High Point features a six-barrel brewing system, which allows them to rapidly rotate multiple beer styles along with the traditional IPA's, Pale Ales, Pilsners, Wheats, Porters and Stouts.



Coltrane Festival

For a decade, jazz enthusiasts have descended to Oak Hollow Festival Park each Labor Day Weekend to hear some of the world's most renowned jazz musicians, including Patty Austin, Kirk Whalum, Ravi Coltrane, Stanley Clarke, George Duke, Poncho Sanchez, Dave Koz and Friends, Boney James, Eric Gales, Gregory Porter, Kenny G, and more. In addition to the festival, High Point has commemorated Coltrane, who grew up in High Point, with an eight foot tall bronze statue, located at the Coltrane Plaza in downtown High Point and a Coltrane Exhibit, housed at the High Point Museum, featuring various artifacts, including a piano from his childhood home on Underhill Street in High Point.





Congdon Yards

Fueled by the belief that downtown High Point was ready to become a place that hums with energy and activity every single day of the year, Congdon Yards is a multi-purpose development built for the people who will blaze our future. It's a place for innovators to connect and collaborate, for leaders to inspire and educate, and for friends and neighbors to gather, play, and celebrate. It's also the home of The Generator, which makes industrial-grade woodworking machinery accessible to all furniture designers and makers, interior designers and architects — as well as small, medium and large furniture companies.



Nido & Mariana Qubein Children's Museum

The Nido & Mariana Qubein Children's Museum, slated to open later this year, is designed with children of all ages in mind. Twenty exhibits expanding across two floors will include "Hall of Mysteries", where you can solve clues, "Kids Point" a small town that resembles High Point, "STEAM Lab" (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts & Math), "Ginormous" a big room for little kids and so much more. Oh, did we mention the Double-Decker Carousel that will hold up to 76 people, big and small?



Stock + Grain Assembly

Stock + Grain Assembly, the Triad's first Food Hall, is moving closer to completion. A grand opening is being planned for March 2022 and will also host a winter preview with select merchants in January and February 2022. Visitors can expect modern furniture with pops of color sourced locally from Davis Furniture and an outdoor patio boasting a bar looking toward Truist Point Stadium with seats for 100 patrons. Inside will seat 200. Food artisans include Biscuits Briskets & Beer, Pop's Mini Doughnut Shop and Yumi Sushi.

So it's only fitting that the American Home Furnishing Hall of Fame has chosen High Point as their new home. The new space is slated to break ground this year & officially open in 2023, and it will be a world-class gathering place and a center for leadership in the High Point Market.
